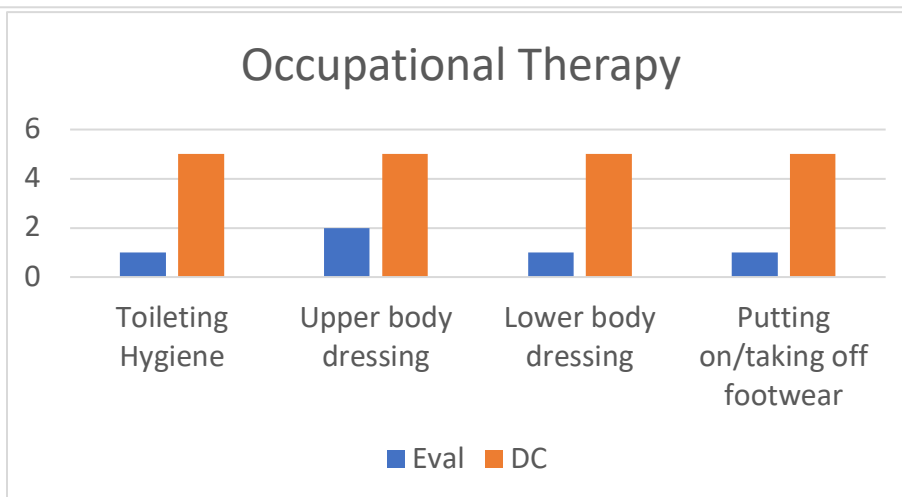
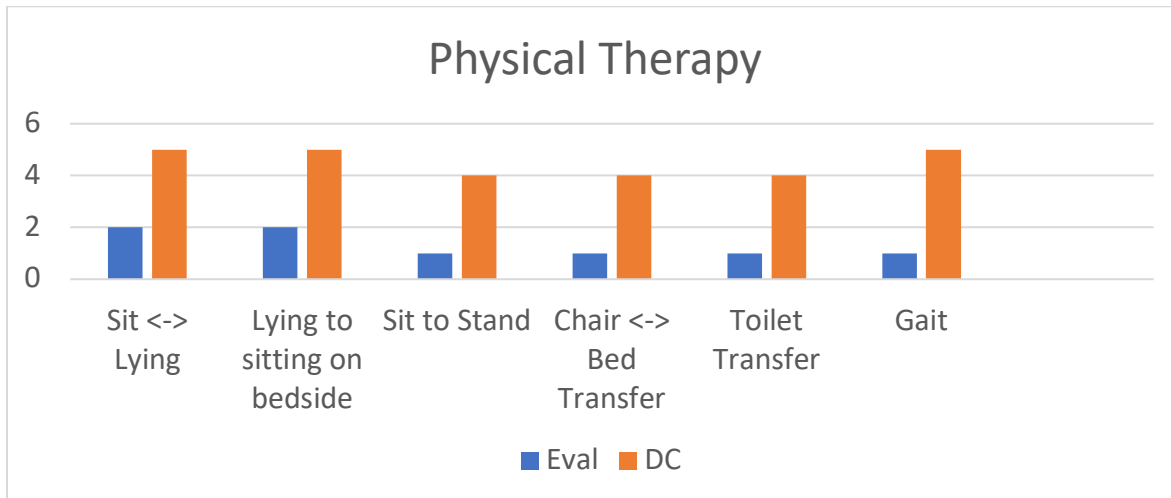


Mr. Barry is 68-year-old male that was diagnosed in the hospital with displaced intertrochanteric fracture of left femur. He was admitted to Park Manor of South Belt on July 8th, 2023.

Mr. Barry was evaluated by both Physical and Occupational Therapy. The initial physical therapy assessment indicated that Mr. Barry required total assist for gait and transfers. His bed mobility was maximum assist. During his initial evaluation he could not put any weight on his leg because of the fracture of his left femur even though he was weight bearing as tolerated. Occupational Therapy's initial assessment for upper body dressing, lower body dressing, toileting, and putting on his shoes was a maximum assist. Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy created plans of care that were individualized for Mr. Barry. Mr. Barry also participated in our weekly group therapy and expressed how much more motivated and excited he was to participate with therapy.

Prior to his hospitalization, he was able to complete all daily activities with no assistance. Mr. Barry is a very caring, quiet, determined, and sweet person to all the other patients and staff. He was rarely in bed and ready to start the day with therapy. If Mr. Barry did not participate in physical and occupational therapy, he would continue to have muscle weakness and be more dependent with his transfers, gait, and ADLs.

After Mr. Barry worked with skilled physical and occupational rehabilitation, he demonstrates significant improvements in his functional mobility and ability to perform all activities of daily living. Mr. Barry improved his ability for his bed mobility, transfers, dressing, and toileting to stand by assist. Mr. Barry was able to walk over 100ft with a rolling walker with stand by assist. Mr. Barry was able to be discharged from the facility after 21 days stay at Park Manor of South Belt and return home with the support of his family. It was such a pleasure working with Mr. Barry!



MDS Section GG Functional Scores	
06 - Independent	Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper
05 - Setup or clean-up assistance	Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.
04 - Supervision or touching assistance	Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.
03 - Partial/moderate assistance	Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs, but provides less than half the effort.
02 - Substantial/maximal assistance	Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.
01 - Dependent	Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
