



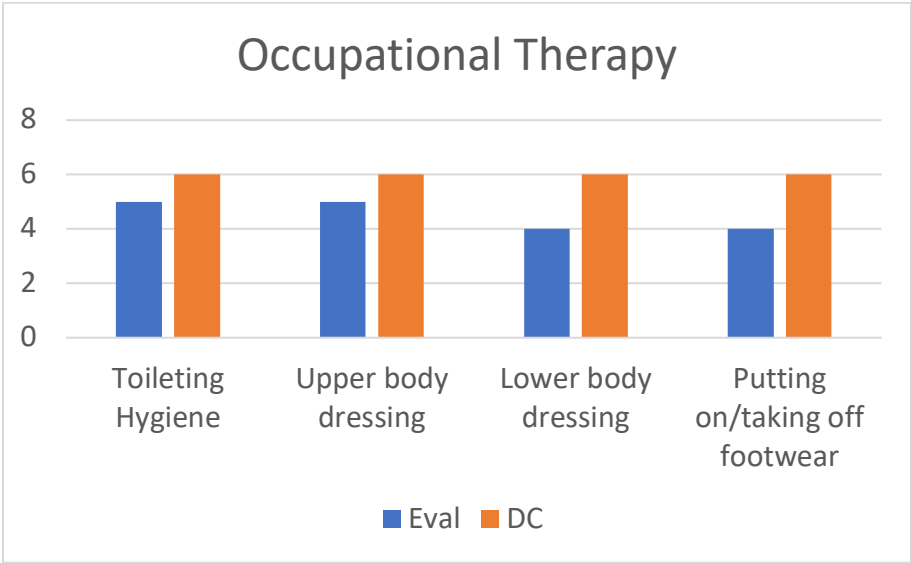
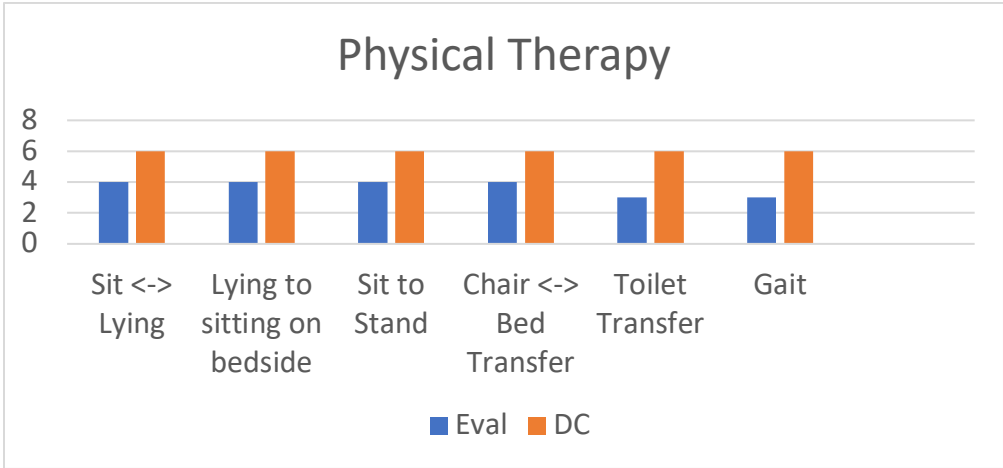
## OUTCOMES MATTER

Mr. Gonzalez is 64-year-old male came with Sezary disease, Pneumonia, and Klebsiella bacteria. He was admitted to Park Manor of South Belt on September 9th, 2023.

Mr. Gonzalez was evaluated by both Physical and Occupational Therapy. The initial physical therapy assessment indicated that Mr. Gonzalez required minimal to moderate assistance for transfers and gait with a rolling walker. Occupational Therapy's initial assessment indicated that Mr. Gonzalez required minimal assistance with upper body dressing. He required moderate assistance for lower body dressing, toileting, and putting on his shoes. Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy created plans of care that were individualized for Mr. Gonzalez, who worked extensively with both physical therapy and occupational therapy to obtain the strength needed to improve his independence. Prior to his hospitalization, he was able to complete all daily activities independently, with no assistance.

Mr. Gonzalez participated in therapy and was very motivated because he knew his goal was to go back home, living with his brother. After a few days of therapy, Mr. Gonzalez started to walk himself down to the gym to start his mornings off with therapy. If Mr. Gonzalez did not participate in physical and occupational therapy, he would have muscle weakness and impaired balance.

After Mr. Gonzalez skilled physical and occupational rehabilitation, he demonstrates significant improvements in his functional mobility and ability to perform all activities of daily living. Mr. Gonzalez was walking over 300' without an assisted device. He was able to do all tasks independently such as dressing, toileting, and gait. Mr. Gonzalez was able to be discharged from the facility after 15 days stay at Park Manor of South Belt and return home with the support of his family. Most of all, Mr. Gonzalez was highly motivated and happy of the progress he made at Park Manor or South Belt!



MDS Section GG Functional Scores	
<b>06 - Independent</b>	Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper
<b>05 - Setup or clean-up assistance</b>	Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.
<b>04 - Supervision or touching assistance</b>	Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.
<b>03 - Partial/moderate assistance</b>	Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs, but provides less than half the effort.
<b>02 - Substantial/maximal assistance</b>	Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.
<b>01 - Dependent</b>	Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
