



OUTCOMES MATTER




Mr. Kelly was evaluated by both Physical and Occupational Therapy. The initial physical therapy assessment indicated that Mr. Kelly required minimum assistance for gait, transfers, and bed mobility. At first, Mr. Kelly was only able to walk 10 feet with moderate assistance but was not sturdy as his knees kept buckling and was very unsteady. Occupational Therapy's initial assessment for upper body dressing, lower body dressing, and toileting required max assistance. Physical Therapy and Occupational Therapy created plans of care that were individualized for Mr. Kelly. Mr. Kelly expressed how motivated and excited he was to participate with therapy. He loved working with the therapist and would always stay in the gym to spend extra time chatting with the therapists.

Prior to his hospitalization, he was able to complete all daily activities with no assistance. Mr. Kelly is a very active, talkative, determined, and sweet person to all the other patients and staff. He was always moving about in the facility making frequent visits to the gym just to hang out with the therapists! He was so grateful for the therapy department at Park Manor of South Belt and he made sure to tell the therapist that every day.

After Mr. Kelly worked with skilled physical and occupational rehabilitation, he demonstrates significant improvements in his functional mobility and ability to perform all activities of daily living. Mr. Kelly improved his ability for his bed mobility, transfers, gait, dressing and toileting to independent. Mr. Kelly is now able to walk over 80 feet with a cane. Mr. Kelly was able to be discharged from the facility after 17 days stay at Park Manor of South Belt and return home with the support of his cousins nearby. MDS Section GG Functional Scores

06 - Independent

Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper

05- Setup or clean-up assistance

Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.

04 - Supervision or touching assistance

Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.

03 - Partial/moderate assistance

 $\label{thm:effort:Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs, but provides less than half the effort.$

02 - Substantial/maximal assistance

Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.

01 - Dependen

Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
